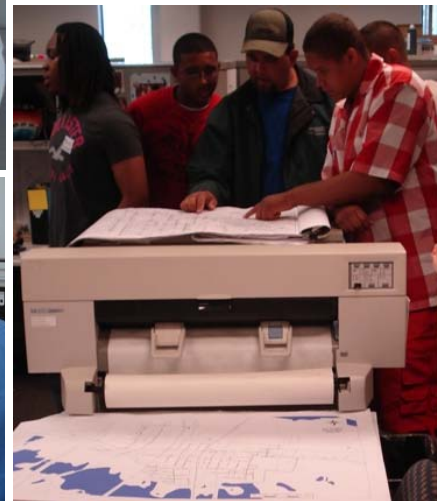

What is a safe buffer around a gas line? How does metal and plastic welding differ? Eleven Robeson County high school students, all taking classes toward an NCCER* certification, had the opportunity to see their lessons in action in the workplace during a visit to Piedmont Natural Gas in Fayetteville. They checked out service and construction trucks, located a gas line, explored the evolution to computer-based drafting, and saw where the welders fabricate steel pipe into natural gas meter and regulating stations.
